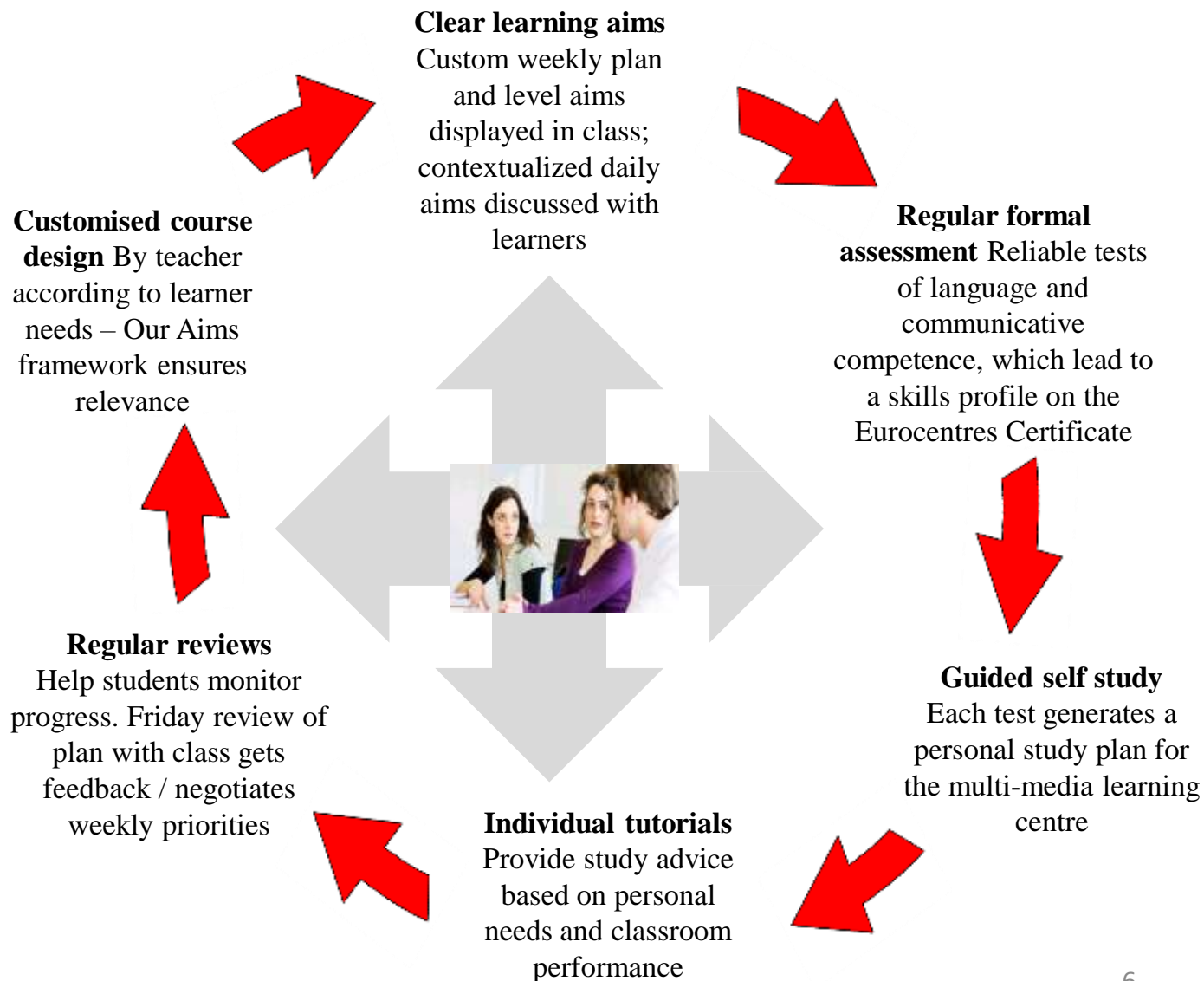
Free Academic Preparation Class

In addition to the elective classes, and to further aid in student progression, a free academic preparation class is offered to all students in a number of different formats. This class is free for students who are not on track to improve on schedule, for students who need remedial support in their weaker skills, for students who require further standardized test practice and for students who want to accelerate their improvement rate.

The Academic Preparation Class may include:

- Small group tutorials focusing on specific needs such as writing and grammar.
- Supervised homework study sessions with a teacher.
- Formal peer mentoring sessions overseen by the Director of Studies.
- Workshop sessions on study skills, organization and cultural adjustments.
- IELTS/TOEFL and/or other standardized test practice.

PATHWAYS STRUCTURE OVERVIEW

Pre-Pathway

- Levels 1-5
- Students integrated into regular ESL classes for foundations of English.
- Focus placed on the development of Grammar, Vocabulary, Reading, Writing, Listening, and Speaking.
- 20, 25 or 30 x 50-minute lessons per week + five hours self-study per week in the Learning Centre

Pathway I

- Levels 6-7
- Students will build on the foundations of English skills, and shift more towards developing the skills which are essential for university bound students
- 25 or 30 x 50-minute lessons per week + five hours self-study per week in the Learning Centre

Pathway II

- Levels 7-9
- Students will shift more towards English for Academic Purposes. They will work on refining the skills that they learned in the earlier levels, however the focus will move to those skills that will be necessary for life as a university student. In Pathway II, students will focus on note-taking techniques, summarizing lectures, and building and developing research and presentation techniques
- 25 or 30 x 50-minute lessons per week + five hours self-study per week in the Learning Centre

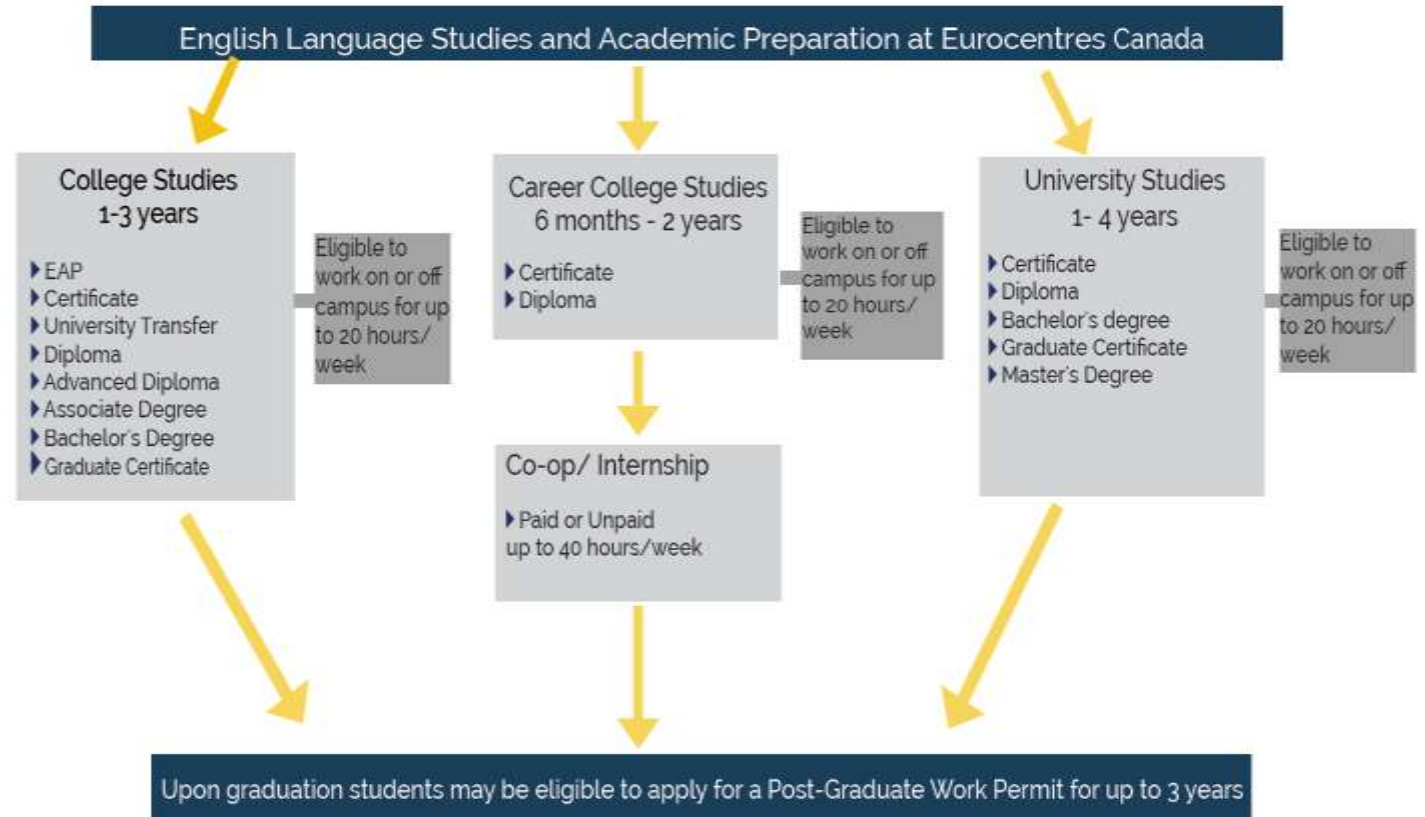
Additional Activities

2 1-hour student workshops on topics such as essay writing, research and presentation skills, study and note-taking skills, and independent projects.

Application Process

1. The student completes our Online Level Assessment.
2. The student writes a short essay expressing their interest in the Pathways program and their desired programs and sends it to the Pathways Director.
3. The Pathways Director will then provide a timeline of how many weeks the student will need to study in order to reach the level required by their chosen institution.

CO-OP

Some programs include work experience as part of their curriculum. International students may apply for a co-op or intern work permit if:

- they have a valid study permit,
- working is a key part of their study program in Canada,
- they have a letter from the institution that confirms all students in the program need to complete work placements to get their degree
- the co-op or internship is 50 per cent or less of the total program of study.

International students aren't eligible for a co-op work permit if they are studying:

- English as a second language (ESL) or
- general interest courses or courses to prepare for another study program.

The acceptance letter must confirm that a co-op or internship placement is part of the program's curriculum. They then only need to apply for a study permit and the work permit will be processed as part of their application

WORKING OFF CAMPUS

You may work off-campus without a work permit if you:

- have a valid study permit
- are a **full-time student** at a designated learning institution (DLI)
- have started studying
- are in a program that leads to a degree, diploma or certificate and is at least six months long and
- have a Social Insurance Number (SIN)

POST-GRADUATE WORK PERMIT

The Post-Graduation Work Permit Program (PGWPP) allows students who have graduated from a **participating Canadian post-secondary institution** to gain valuable Canadian work experience. Skilled Canadian work experience gained through the PGWPP helps graduates qualify for permanent residence in Canada through the Canadian experience class.

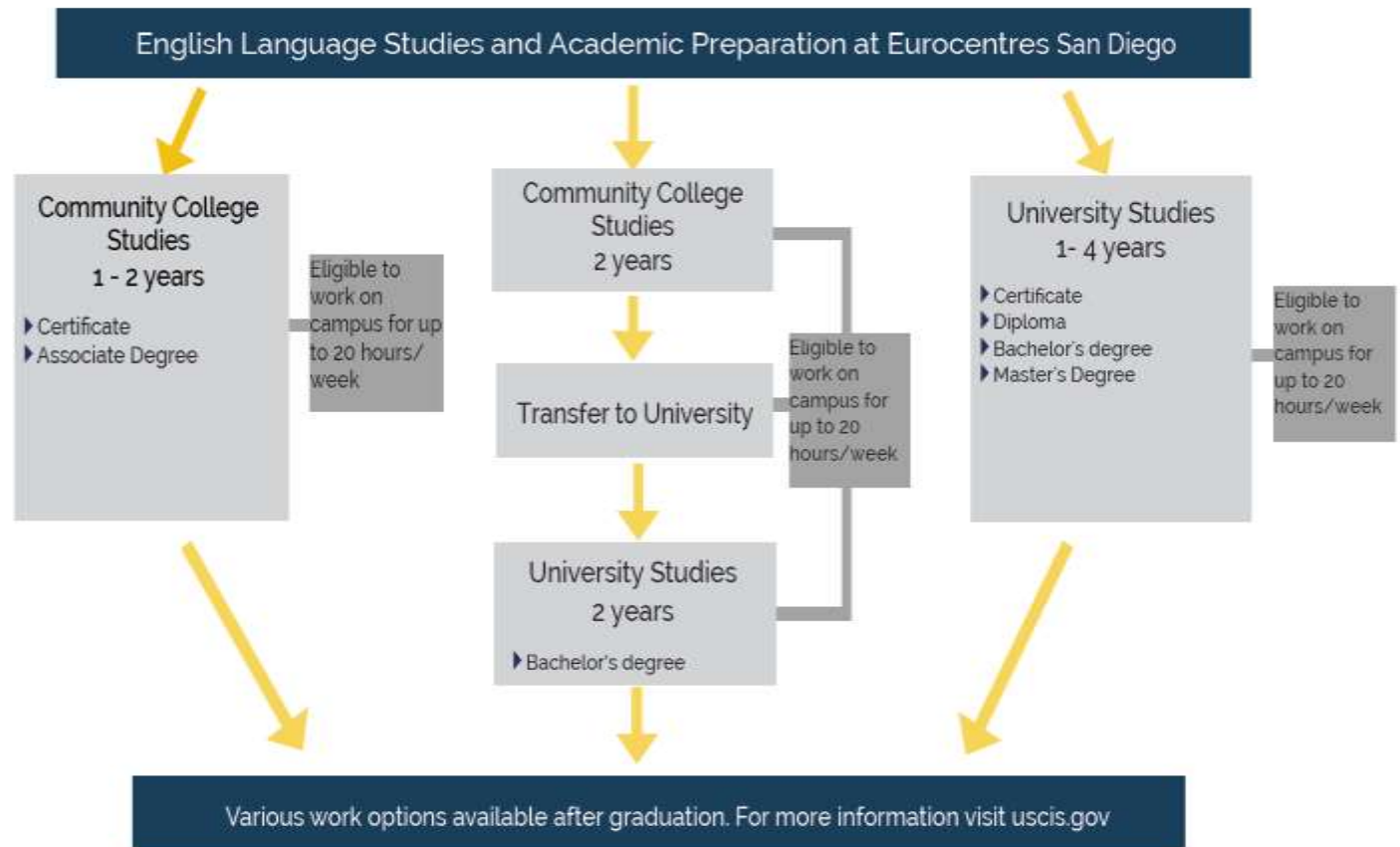

A work permit under the PGWPP may be issued for the length of the study program, for a maximum of three years. A post-graduation work permit cannot be valid for longer than the student's study program, which must be a minimum of eight months in duration.

To obtain a work permit under the PGWPP, the applicant must meet the following requirements:

- have a valid study permit when applying for the work permit;
- have continuously studied **full time in Canada** (i.e., studies must have taken place at a Canadian educational institution) and have completed a program of study that is at least **eight months** in duration;
- have completed and passed the program of study and received a written notification from the educational institution indicating that they are eligible to obtain a degree, diploma or certificate.

WORKING ON CAMPUS

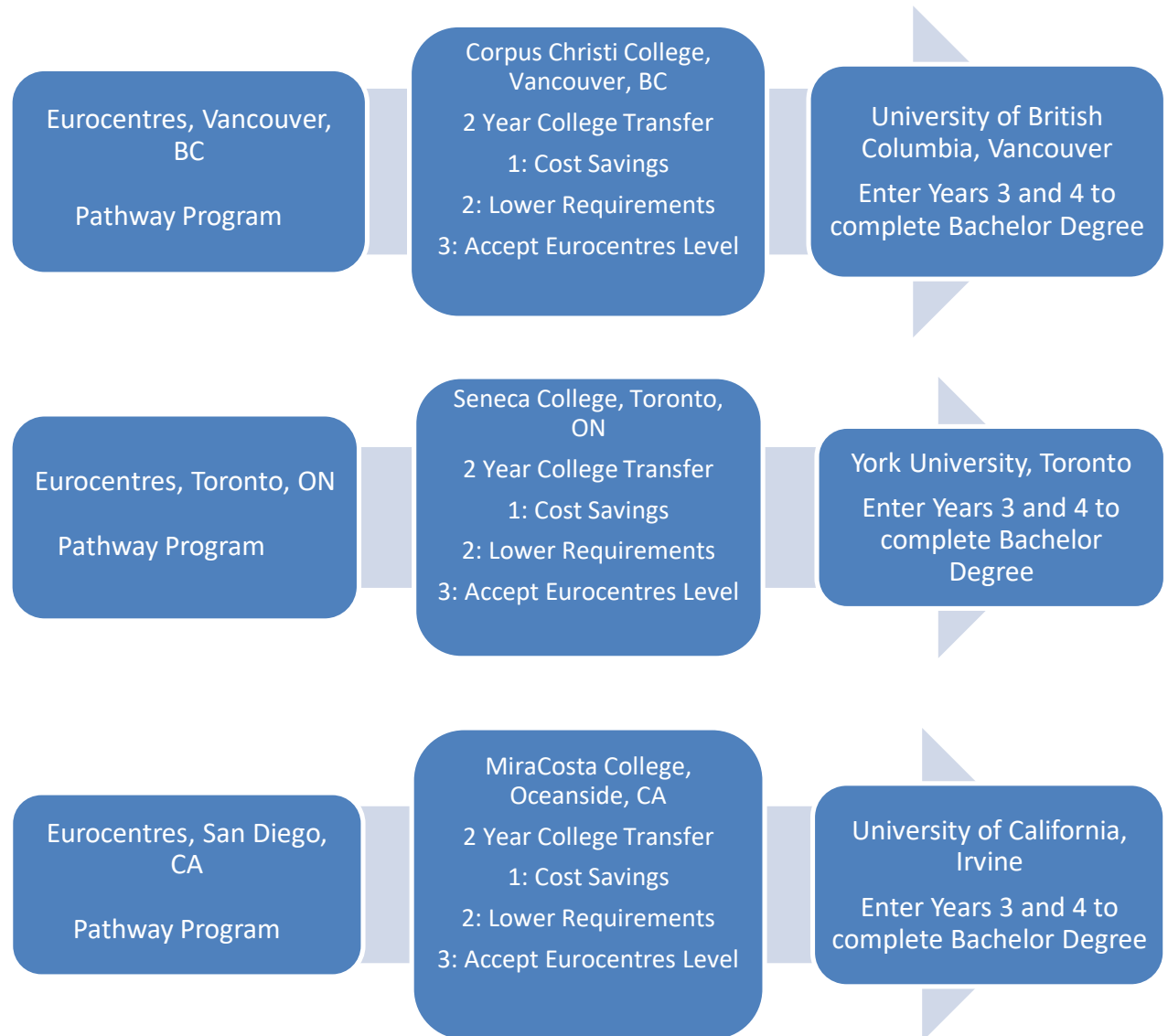
For on-campus work, an F-1 student is subject to the following rules:

- Must maintain valid F-1 status
- Can work up to 20 hours per week while the institution is in session (bookstore, cafeteria etc if there is availability)
- Can work full-time on campus during holidays and vacation periods if they intend to register for the next academic semester
- The employment may not displace (take a job away from) a U.S. resident

WORKING OFF CAMPUS – OPTIONAL PRACTICAL TRAINING

- International students in the U.S. in valid F-1 immigration status are permitted to work off-campus in optional practical training (OPT) status both during and after completion of their degree.
- All OPT employment requires prior authorization from USCIS and from the institution's International Student Office.
- Full details and requirements can be found on the USCIS website
- Pre-completion OPT (students are still in school) and post-completion OPT (students have completed their degree) each have different rules
