



Owned/funded by the state	Owned/funded privately
Larger (above 10,000 students)	Smaller (below 10,000 students)
Available 'in-state tuition' vs. 'out of state tuition'	Price the same for everyone

# What is the difference between private universities and private colleges?


Private Universities	Private Colleges
Generally larger (above 3,000 students)	Generally smaller (below 3,000 students)
Doctoral programs	Generally no doctoral (pHD) programs
Master's degree programs	Master's degree programs
Four-year bachelor's degree	Four-year bachelor's degree

# What is the difference between private colleges and community colleges?

Private Colleges	Community Colleges
Privately funded	Publicly funded
Smaller (below 3,000 students)	Larger (above 10,000 students)
Master's degree programs	None
30:1 student to teacher ratio	150:1 student to transfer advisor ratio
Four-year bachelor's degree programs	Only two-year associate's degree
Most students living on-campus	Most students living off-campus
General age range of 18-24	Age range of 18-60
All professors have doctorates	Not all professors have doctorates


# When do you 'declare your major' in a bachelor's degree?


The end of the second year

# Why our bachelor's degree program is a wonderful option for students

1. 71% of our students transfer into the top-100
2. 40% of our students transfer into the top-50
3. All starting locations offer a full bachelor's degree, so students do not *need* to transfer, as the case would be at a community college
4. Students are not in a foundation or international student program. Thus, from the start, students are in a real, true, American bachelor's degree, studying alongside Americans
5. We don't let students give up on their dreams!

# Intakes + Deadlines

- **Unconditional - Bachelor's Degree**
  - Fall (Late August to early September)
  - Spring (Early January)
- **Conditional – Pre-sessional English**
  - Late August to mid-September
  - January
  - Early April
  - Late May/early June
- **Application deadlines**
  - Up until June for the fall intake
  - Up until December for the spring intake

# Bachelor's degree application documents

---

1. Application form
2. Credit card form - \$165 application fee
3. All available high school transcripts/marks + diploma (if available at the time of application)
4. Personal statement
5. Letter of recommendation
6. Official IELTS or TOEFL or Kings online English test (only for conditional offer)

# Bachelor's degree admissions timeline

---

1. Completed application to Kings admissions USA
2. Admissions decision takes two weeks
3. If admitted, student pays tuition-deductible I-20 deposit, along with submitting other confirmation documents to Kings admissions USA
4. Once all confirmation documents received, Kings admissions USA sends I-20 within two weeks
5. Visa interview
6. Student pays one month prior to start of course (or after visa is received and pre-arrival)
7. Upon arrival, student brings five original copies of final high school transcripts and diploma
