






So if you only declare your major at the end of year-two, what do you do the first two years?












The US Transfer System

- 4. Personal statement
- 5. Letter of recommendation
- 6. Official IELTS or TOEFL or Kings online English test (only for conditional offer)



Bachelor's degree admissions timeline

- 1. Completed application to Kings admissions USA
- 2. Admissions decision takes two weeks
- 3. If admitted, student pays tuition-deductible I-20 deposit, along with submitting other confirmation documents to Kings admissions USA
- Once all confirmation documents received, Kings admissions USA sends I-20 within two weeks
- 5. Visa interview
- 6. Student pays one month prior to start of course (or after visa is received and pre-arrival)
- 7. Upon arrival, student brings five original copies of final high school transcripts and diploma
