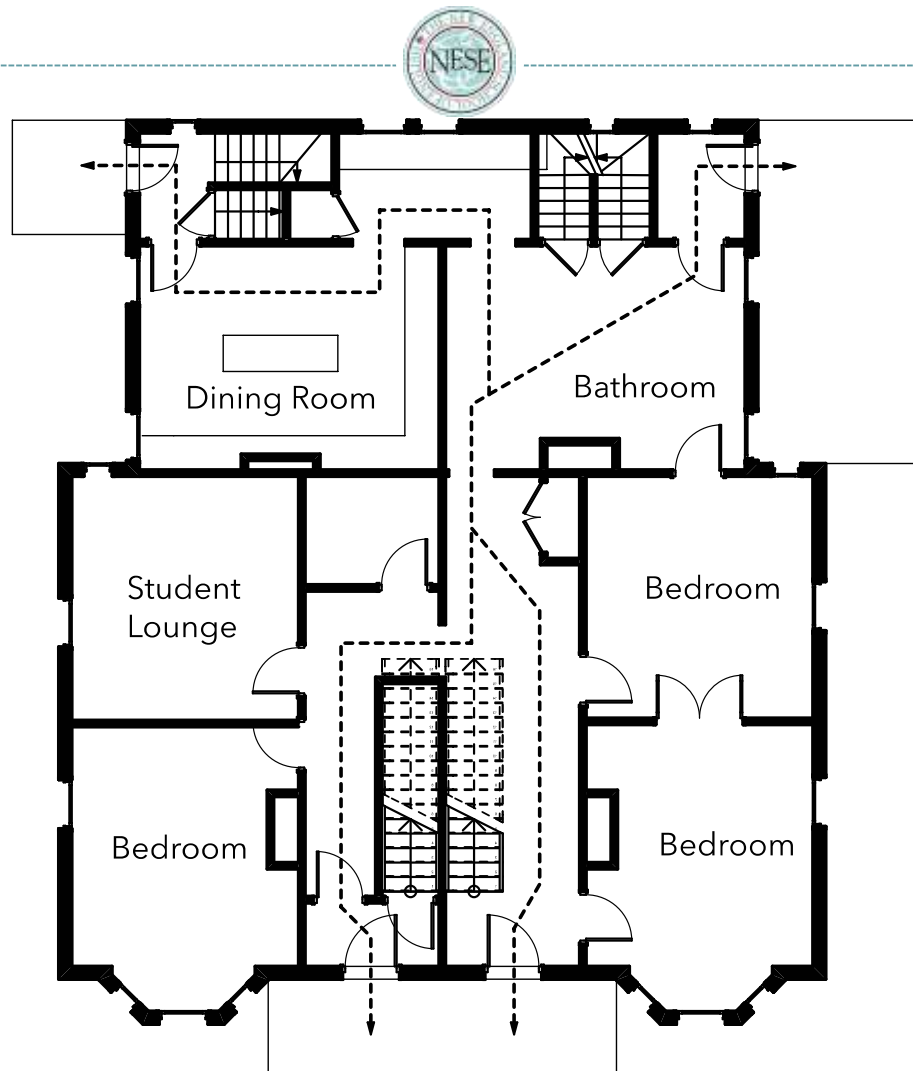
Green Hall Floor Plan

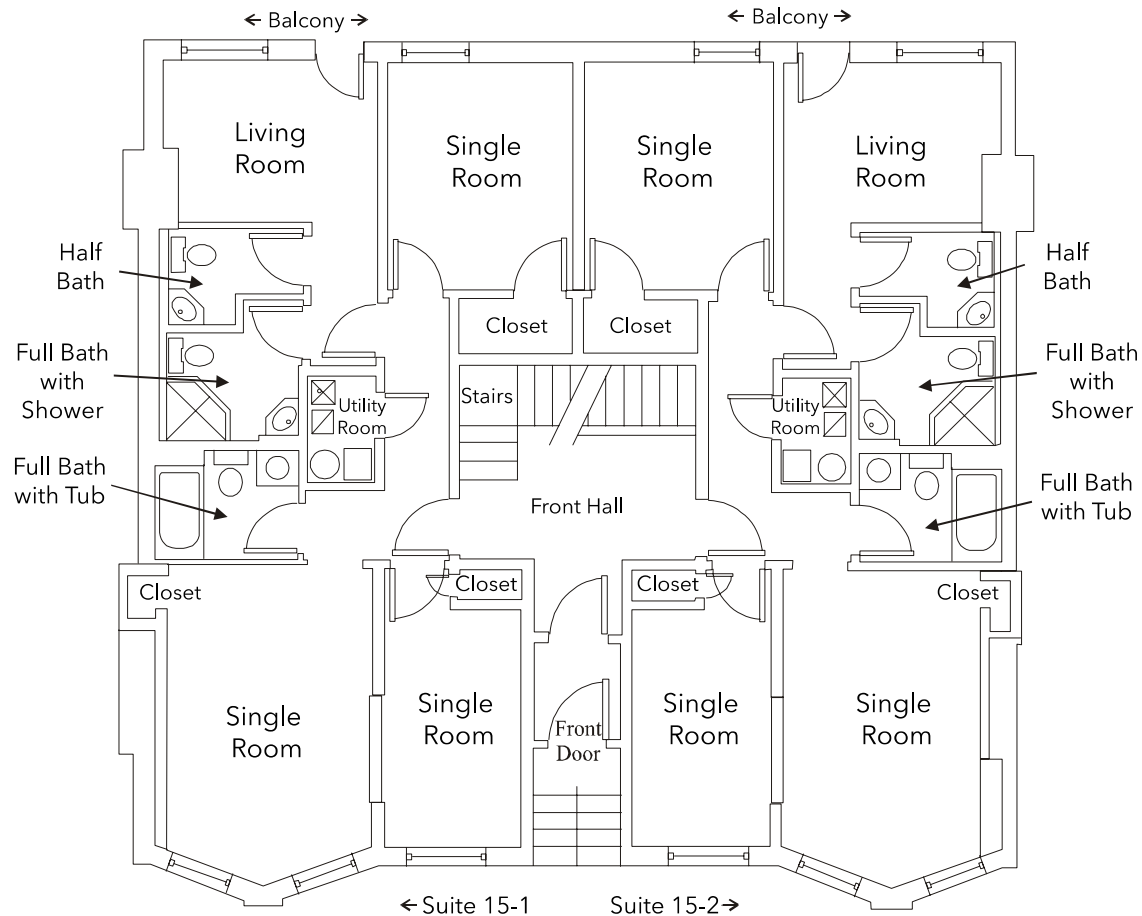
Poppet Hall Floor Plan

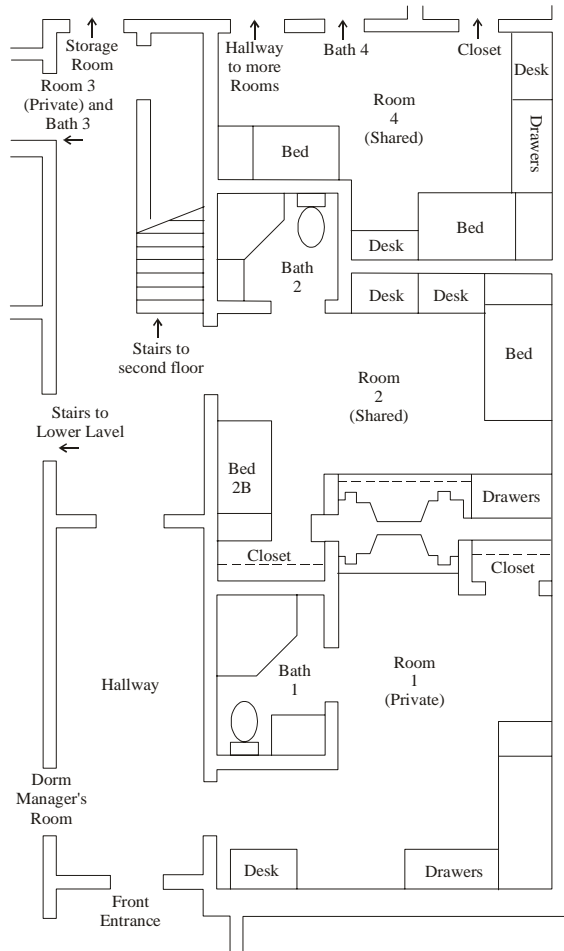
Green Hall Executive Center Floor Plan

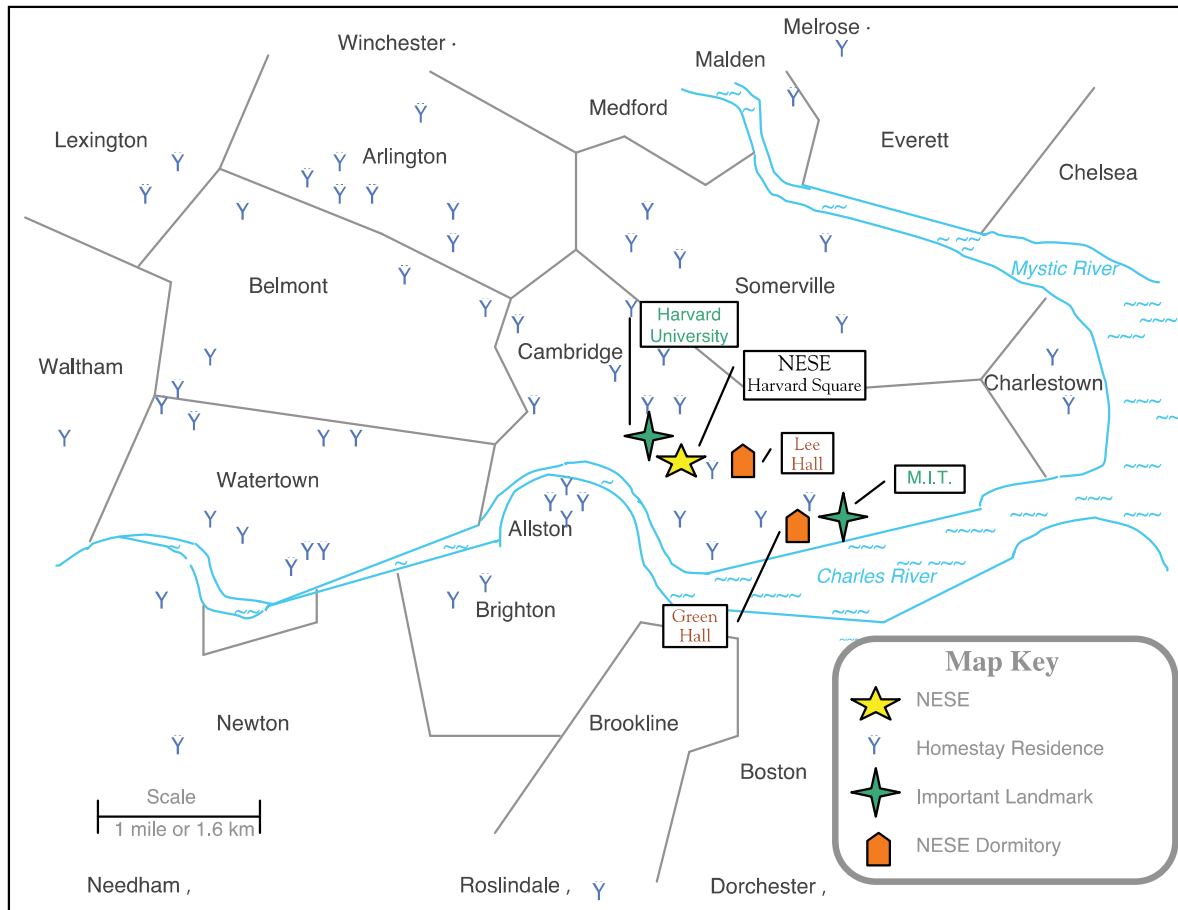

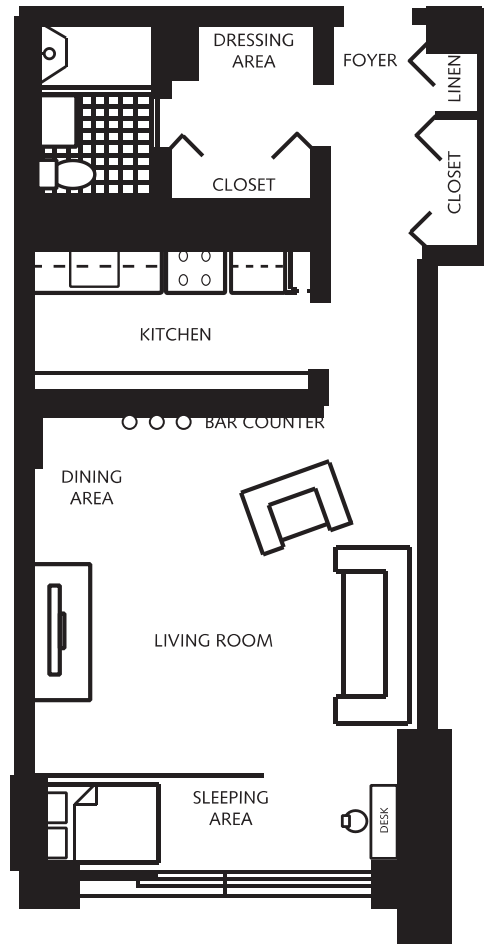

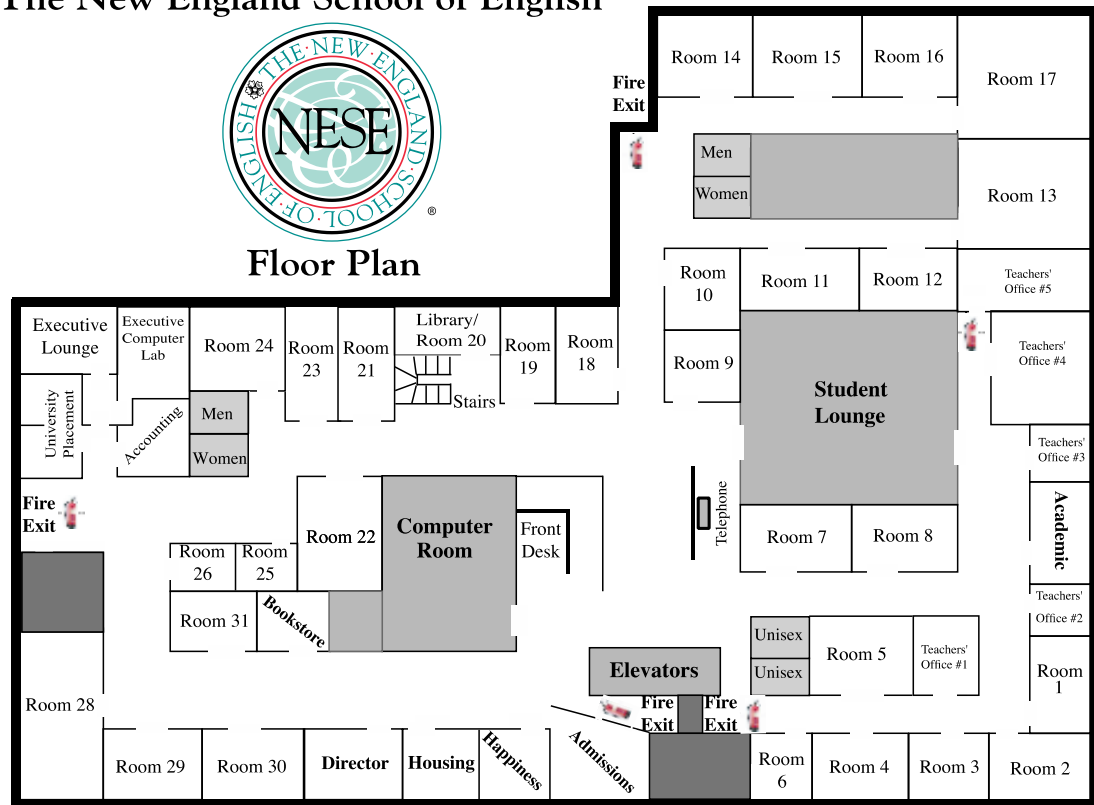

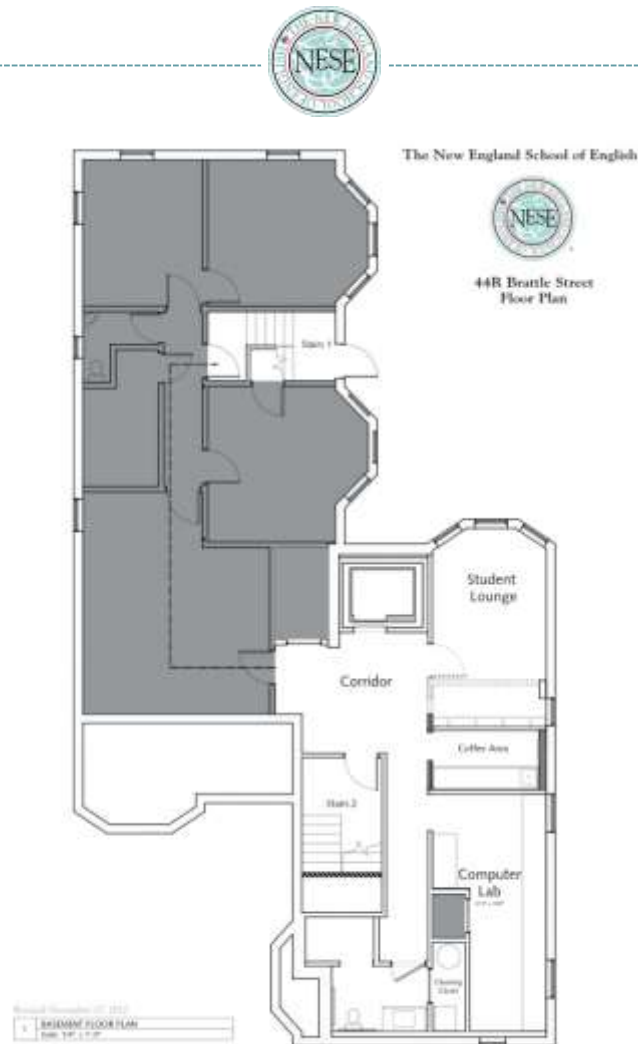

- ◆ Students only receive a certificate if they pass their classes: attendance, participation, and homework are required.
- ◆ NESE starts a new course every 4 weeks ONLY (classes do NOT start every Monday). Dates are published.

- ◆ NESE has 10 levels, as well as a choice of electives.
- ◆ NESE is closed at 4 different times per year for 1-2 weeks (for a total of 4-5 weeks, depending on the calendar). Housing remains open but there is an extra fee to stay in housing during this time.
