








Canada	4	\$51,324






# Outcomes: Earn while you learn

# Outcomes: Starting salaries

Graduates of a two year degree are eligible for a post-study work visa.

Australia's average graduate starting annual salary is comparatively high.

Destination	Average Starting Annual Salary (USD)	
USA	\$54,214	
Australia/NZ	\$46,585	
Canada	\$44,017	
UK	\$40,649	





### Accommodation

#### **Homestay**

- Under 18s. Guaranteed.
- Includes meals- 1-3 times a day (dependent on preference)
- Live with an Australian family

#### **On-Campus**

- Single room accommodation
- Usually ensuite (depends on the college)
- Internet/Electricity included

#### **Off-campus**

- Referral service with trusted lettings agents
- More choice. Often less expensive
- Internet/Electricity not included (usually)
